PBIS Implementation

- 3 PBIS AZ funded schools
 - Kenilworth, Garfield, Dunbar
- 5 schools funded through IDEA, Medicaid
 - Bethune, Emerson, Shaw, Lowell, Whittier
- 1 school funded through Character Ed grant
 - Herrera

Resulting in an estimated 60 staff trained and impacting over 3,000 students which represents 40% of the student population in PHX EL







- Purchase Second Step Curriculum for all grades, Lead Social Worker will provide training, support, and accountability to School Social Workers to ensure it's used correctly and effectively at school sites
- Continue to contract with KOI to provide trainings to new staff at the beginning of each school year and provide training to braid RTI and PBIS at district sponsored professional development trainings.
- Continue to attend School Board meetings twice each year to report to the Board and to the public the successes that the schools are having reducing ODRs and Restraints
- Highlight PBIS schools progress and achievement in student service newsletter twice a year
