OUTCOMES – All schools

When comparing data collected from schools from the 2010/11 school-year and the 2013/14 school-year, positive movement on several indicators is observed. These are outlined below in more detail.

INCIDENT DATA

Incident data was collected annually by schools. Listed below are the top 5 areas where the biggest changes were observed:

- 90% of schools experienced declines in student aggression (e.g. verbal provocation, disorderly conduct)
- 90% of schools experienced declines in fights on campus
- 80% of schools reported reductions in graffiti or tagging
- 75% of schools reported declines in attendance policy violations such as students being tardy, leaving school grounds without permission, and unexcused absences
- 70% of schools reported **declines in** other **school policy violations**, such as disruption, dress-code violation and use of inappropriate language
